





Thrilling Round 4: VMRC/Winton 300 Recap





Winton Motor Raceway was busier than an international airport on the weekend of the 16th and 17th September for the fourth round of the Victorian Motor Racing Championship (VMRC) which was joined by the Australian Super Trucks and the Winton 300!

A massive nine separate categories racing, combined with the Winton 300 requiring a three hour slot on the Sunday afternoon, made for an incredibly tight schedule the entire weekend. We have to say a huge thank you to every single volunteer, marshal and safety crew member on the ground who made such an incredibly tight schedule run like clockwork making the weekend the overall success that it was.

Without further ado, congratulations to Andrew Boydell and Jason Walsh who piloted the #791 Mazda MX5 (pictured above) to Winton 300 Victory completing one hundred laps of the three kilometre circuit in 2 hours and 47 minutes. The #818 Honda Integra of Jimmy Tran and Andrew Shah came home second place, the only other team to make it to lap 100 finishing over a minute behind the leaders. Gerry and Leigh Burges in the #33 Evo 9 rounded out the podium completing 98 laps,






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a valiant effort considering the car sustained significant gearbox problems throughout the race. The Toyota 86 of Christoph Heiniger and Daniel Flanagan finished fourth overall winning Class D followed by the Nissan Pulsar of Michael Ricketts and Josh Haynes in fifth overall, winning Class E, a fabulous effort after double stinting in 2 Litre Sports Sedans as well.

Emerging first from the dark clouds of diesel smoke was the Australian Super Truck of Steve Zammit, the Kenworth T401 taking qualifying pole by a massive 2.3 seconds. Zammit went on to win two of the four races, visiting the podium for a third race as well. Following close behind was the Kenworth T900 of Shannon Smith with a race win and P2 finish. Barry Butwell performed well especially in the final two races with a race win and P2 finish to his name as well. For the teams races, Shannon Smith's GLE Racing entry performed extremely well at the hands of Harvey Dale taking a race win and a P2 finish. Lachlan Fern saw similarly successful results in the Fern Earthmoving Volvo with a race win and P3 finish.

After the initiation of Calder Park Raceway last August, the Victorian Motor Racing Championship have scheduled three meetings there in 2024.

The 2023 Winton 300 at the Victorian Motor Racing Championship saw an exciting race where Mazda MX-5 duo Andrew Boydell and Jason Walsh emerged victorious.

They strategically pitted at the halfway mark, ultimately taking the lead as other competitors completed their stops, securing a comfortable 1m and 29s lead.

Andrew Shah and Jimmy Tran came second on the gid. It was the second year in a row that Tran finished the race as the runner-up at Winton.

Meanwhile, Gerry and Leigh Burges, initially strong contenders in their Mitsubishi Evo 9, faced clutch issues but managed to secure third place.

VMRC in 2024

The VMRC will begin at the reinvigorated facility on March 15-17 and will be the first of six rounds, an expansion of two over this year's calendar.

Winton Motor Raceway will host the second round on May 10-12 and the series will alternate with Calder (June 7-9), Winton (August 9-11), Calder (September 20-22) and Winton (November 1-3).

The fourth and sixth rounds will also feature the Winton 300 and the David Lowe Enduro for Excels respectively.

"In 2022 we revived this series to give the competitor groups another choice for a State Championship in Victoria," said Benalla Auto Club Group Manager Stephen Whyte. "We were quick to lock in the dates after we raced at Calder this year.

"The series was a four-round championship then. We gave it a name and we had four categories to start with. By the end of the season, we had eight because people wanted somewhere to race. The championship has had unbelievable growth. This year it grew to five rounds and next year we will have six.

"We have a strong group of categories lined up, which is just amazing and a very positive sign for Winton, Calder, and our sanctioning body AASA".

The 2024 VMRC will include the fan favourite Australian Super Truck Championship which will take in the Winton rounds only. There is a chance they may trial at Calder at some point. The big rigs debuted in Australia with their first race meeting at the Melbourne circuit in 1988.

The categories that will be at both circuits will be the Vic V8s, Victorian Hyundai Excel Championship for Trophy and Masters, Victorian Sports Car Series, Super TT, 2 Litre Sports Sedans together with APRA Pulsars, Australian Hyper Racer Championship, Stock Cars Australia, BMW E30s, HQ Holdens and Legend Cars, depending on their calendar.

races. With a robust lineup of 26 cars, the series featured prominent participants prepared to challenge the regular contenders across four thrilling races.

Jordan Cox, steering Mark Crutcher's Mustang in the owner's absence during the Hi-Tec Oils Super Series, triumphed in the series' opening race. As a TCR star, Cox set the pace during qualifying and dominated the Top 10 Shootout in a competitive field that included multiple Trans Am front runners.



Cox led from the outset and clinched victory, leaving points leader Dylan Thomas (Mustang) trailing in second, while Cody Gillis (Mustang) secured third. Initially contending for the lead, Josh Haynes (Mustang) slipped to 17th after contact with Gillis on Lap 2, yet managed a commendable comeback.





Several technical issues marred the competition: Brett Niall (Camaro) faced overheating, Josh Thomas (Mustang) triggered a Safety Car due to a differential issue, and Josh Anderson (Mustang) retired due to a drivetrain problem.

Elsewhere on the track, the RX8 Cup saw Brock Paine clinching victory ahead of Luke Webber, Justin Lewis, Justin Barnes, and Tim Berryman. Bruce Duckworth emerged victorious in the first Legend Cars race, with Shane Tate reversing the outcome in the second. In the EFS Australian Excel Series, Ryan O'Sullivan claimed first place ahead of Tyler Collins, Blake Tracey, Jaylyn Robotham, and Hugo Simpson.

The Australian Trans Am race saw Ian Palmer (Pontiac Firebird) comfortably securing a win, followed by Sean Englis and John Prefontaine in Ford Mustangs, and Alwyn Bishop (Plymouth Duster) leading the pack ahead of Andy Clempson (Mustang).

Cory Gillett triumphed narrowly in the first Super TT race, driving a Chev-powered Nissan S13, with Graham Elliott (Holden Commodore SS) trailing closely, while Brent Edwards (Ford Falcon XR6 Turbo) impressively surged from the back of the grid to third. Finally, in the Stock Cars category, Danny Burgess claimed victory in an OzTruck-dominated race ahead of Brett Mitchell and Brendon Hourigan.

The inaugural series of this year surpassed all expectations, promising an even more exhilarating 2024 with two days of Live TV coverage and the addition of thrilling categories to the series.

Similar to the preceding rounds, Round 4 featured five sessions. Notable performances included Keith Mere, a BAC member and volunteer, displaying consistent form in his MX-5 in class A1. Clinton Gazelle triumphed in A2, while Manson secured the first position in B1. The junior contenders showcased promising skills, demonstrating their potential.

Round 5: Final Thrills

The season's final round welcomed Super Karts to the field, adding a new dimension to the event. Doug Dick showcased his endurance and commitment by participating in all five rounds, culminating in a well-deserved 1st place in B1. AASA UPDATE



SEPTEMBER SUMMARY The AASA State Championship's fifth round, the Queensland Racing Drivers Championship, brought together a notable lineup of Supercars talent at Queensland Raceway. The EFS 4x4 Accessories Track Attack Excel Cup featured 34 Excels in a "400km Endurance Event," comprising a 100km race and a 300km race.

Top Supercar stars like Anton DePasquale and Zane Goodard, alongside Super 2, Super 3, and Trans Am drivers, participated as co-drivers. Connor Roberts and Ryan Casha dominated Q1, Q2, Top 10 Shootout, and Race 1 but faced a setback during the main 300km race.

The event wasn't short of drama, with incidents involving Jr-Lung Hay Bartlem and Ben Grice, the latter escaping uninjured from a significant roll-over in Race 1.

Nash Morris and Alice Buckley's strategic pit stop during an early safety car period paid off in the 300km Endurance Race, securing them the win, followed by Connor Roberts & Ryan Casha in second and Tyler Collins & Cameron McLeod in third.

The QLD Production Cars hosted a "State of Origin" round welcoming NSW Production Touring Cars competitors. Anthony Levitt paired with Porsche Carrera Cup racer Luke King but faced mechanical issues resulting in a DNF for Race 3. Tom McLennan claimed victory in the final race, trailed by Roman Miller and the NSW duo Matthew Holt & Josh Muggleton.

In the WA Tarmac Rally, over 15,000 spectators gathered for the Make Smoking History Tarmac West. A new format featured three Rallysprint events across Perth. Troy Wilson dominated all three events in his Mitsubishi Evo X, praising the rally as his addiction.

The Ellenbrook Rallysprint saw Wilson securing a clean sweep, followed closely by Matthew O'Neill and Kelly Thomas in their Subaru WRX STi Spec C. Malaga Sprint witnessed Wilson's tire challenges but still clinched victory, with Max Whiting following in second and Alex Rullo recovering for third.

The City of Perth Rallysprint had Wilson securing another triumph, with O'Neill and Thompson in second and Whiting in third, celebrating the event's success and thanking the organizers.

The Engine Shop City Sprint, sans co-drivers, was won by Peter Bergman, trailed by Alexis Hernandez and Harley Owens in a tight finish.





In Speedway, the Western Australian Pro Modified Racing Inc began its season with a showcase at Langley Park's Celebration of Motorsport, displaying Pro Modifieds and generating significant interest, particularly among younger attendees enjoying interactive experiences with racing vehicles.

OCTOBER SUMMARY The Great Tarmac Rally 2023 concluded with the final round held in the Victorian High-Country region. The event covered over 250 kilometers and attracted a field of over 60 cars across various categories. The Super Rally category initially saw the dominance of Jason and Fiona Wright in their R35 Skyline until a fire caused their withdrawal, allowing Mark Cates and Bernie Webb in their Porsche 911 GT2 RS to take the lead but later withdrawing due to weather conditions. Greg Bass & Lance Arundel in a Toyota Yaris GR emerged victorious.



In the Modern 4WD category, Matt Close and Cameron Reeves in an Audi TTRS Sport exhibited consistent performance, securing a class win despite brake overheating issues. Their adept handling in rainy conditions also led them to an outright win. In Modern 2WD, Paul Dowie and John Allen's Porsche GT3RS faced stiff competition from Jeff Morton and Daymon Nicoli's Porsche GT2 RS, with Dowie strategically securing second place to clinch the overall championship.



Liam and Larry Howarth dominated Early Modern 4WD in a Nissan GTR V-Spec, while Dean Lillie and Chris Exner's Mazda RX7 showcased exceptional driving skills, chasing the outright win despite technological disadvantages in Early Modern 2WD.

Other categories like Classic Modified, Classic, Rally Sport, Rally Challenge, and Early Classic witnessed thrilling battles and noteworthy performances from various teams.

The Australian Tarmac Rally Championship for 2024 will kick off at the Lake Mountain Sprint in March, followed by subsequent rounds including the Snowy River Sprint and the Great Tarmac Rally before concluding with the challenging Mt Baw Baw.

Moreover, the Victorian Motor Racing Championship (VMRC) is expanding to six rounds in 2024, offering grass-roots categories a structured and affordable racing platform. The championship will feature various categories partnering with headline events like the Australian Super Trucks and others such as the Hyper Racer Championship, Vic V8s, Hyundai Excel Championship, Sports Car Series, among others.

In the off-road racing realm, the Teagle Excavations ARB Pines Enduro 400 witnessed Danny Brown and George Apted securing a dominant victory, while Brent Martin and Andrew de Simone captured their third ARB Australian Off Road Racing Championship title.

Additionally, the TSOA Kwinana Autotest event showcased an impressive mix of cars competing in challenging conditions, with various classes and the introduction of a 'regularity' class for less competitive entrants.

Finally, the Pro Mod Masters at Geraldton City Speedway featured a strong lineup with Matt Bosveld aiming to defend his title against a competitive field.

These events showcased thrilling competitions, outstanding performances, and highlighted the dedication and skill of participants across diverse motorsport categories in Australia.
